Preventive and multimodal analgesia Decrease anaesthetic and analgesic requirements

Prevent persistent post-surgical pain

Reduce anaestheticrelated deaths

Blunt stress response to surgery

Provide intra and early postoperative pain relief

- Veterinarians do not often use or are unfamiliar with these techniques
 - These techniques are not often taught in the veterinary curriculum
- The use of local anesthetics is often ranked lower in importance than other analgesic modalities in clinical practice
